About the Community

Stanislaus County is located in Central California within 90 minutes of the San Francisco Bay Area, the Silicon Valley, Sacramento, the Sierra Nevada Mountains, and California's Central Coast. With over 500,000 people calling this agricultural heartland home, the community reflects a region rich in diversity with a strong sense of community.

Modesto is home to a vibrant arts community with the world-class Gallo Center for the Arts, a symphony orchestra, and abundant visual and performing arts, as well as an affordable cost of living. Stanislaus County is a global center for agribusiness, positioned by its mild Mediterranean climate, rich soils, and progressive farming practices. The area is recognized internationally for agricultural innovation with wine, almonds, poultry, milk, cattle, and walnuts being some of the featured industries.

About VCME

The Valley Consortium for Medical Education (VCME) was founded in 2009 as a non-profit, community benefit organization to create and foster graduate and undergraduate medical education in the Central Valley. Located in Modesto, California, the Consortium, a non-profit 501(c)(3), currently has participation from major health care organizations in Stanislaus County, and has an affiliation with the University of California, Davis School of Medicine. VCME offers fourth-year medical student elective rotations for medical students wishing to apply to our residencies.

Family Medicine residents focus their outpatient training at our Federally-Qualified Look-alike Clinic, which is located in the socioeconomically-disadvantaged neighborhood of West Modesto and was recognized as the first federally-funded Teaching Health Center in California, starting in 2010. Inpatient training occurs at Doctors Medical Center, a 400+ bed hospital that combines high-quality faculty with high-technology settings to deliver first class training experiences. Community-based teaching keeps the training practical, relevant, and real world for graduates to quickly assimilate into diverse community settings throughout California's Central Valley.

The Position

The Program Director maintains a footprint that is approximately 70% administrative and 30% clinical. She or he is responsible for the general administration of the Family Medicine Residency Program, including those activities related to accreditation and to the recruitment, selection, instruction, supervision, counseling, evaluation, and advancement of residents. The Program Director also works closely with a team of seven talented and dedicated core faculty to cultivate and maintain an inspiring learning experience for the residents.
